Kami places the unmei (the soul) that corresponds with the jittai of that family in the physical body.

That unmei-jittai guides the life of that human being.

Knowing this truth—principle about life, shinja must have the awareness to elevate their jittai.

Why must family members learn the teachings together and be a family that interacts with one another based on the principles?

Human beings, who are unable to understand what divine providence is, cannot make the best of their unmei-jittai.

They do not know about the path that leaves behind good elements in their family.

Hence, the kokoro of what it means to be a human being is not passed on; this is why there is confusion and suffering in life.

The jittai is lowered, the unmei fades away, and life ends without ever attaining kaiun.

## To the Shinja

The family is a vital environment that enables human beings to acquire the kokoro of what it means to be a human being.

If the teachings are a part of a family, human beings will always elevate their jittai, be guided, protected and saved by their unmei's strengths in Kami's hands.

This is the life of the human being who attains kaiun.
