When the principles sustain human life, humanity will live in a society of peace.

Summary of the Shinji

Despite humanity's continuous endeavors in politics, the economy, education, and medical care, the problems today continue to be unending. Practices and conventions that were the norm until very recently no longer hold true. Despite trial-and-error countermeasures, we are unable to cope with the circumstances. Faced with this situation, humanity has begun to feel bewildered and to gradually become aware that "something is not right."

Culture gradually develops from the distinctive traits that characterize a region and reflects the customs and way of life of the community. People, who live in the cities and in remote and isolated areas, travel in different ways according to the norms of that region. When seen in the context of time, the way people lived in the Edo era is completely different to how Japanese live today. This is because the way we live reflects an era and culture of that time. Be the wife and mother, who together with her husband, connects the *kokoro* of their children. Be the honest child who is able to talk to their parents about everything. Learn the teachings with your family, make them a part of each family members' *kokoro*; the guaranteed path to happiness is the repeated effort to live by the principles.

There is a sense of peace and security by just being together in a family where there is empathy and understanding, and we are filled with a sense of happiness. All endeavors based on the principles will be about cooperation and harmony; and we will experience joy, meaning and purpose. Peace grows in societies where families live in harmony.
